#### In Loving Memory of: Nannette Green

Nanette started life in the Vancouver General Hospital in British Columbia. In later years, a sister and a half-brother would complete the family. She mentioned with a chuckle, her own oldest daughter and her younger half-brother are almost the same age. How cool is that!

At 20 years of age, Nanette joined the Royal Canadian Air Force (RCAF) taking her initial training at St. Hubert, Quebec. As a young Recreational Specialist, she was off to Aylmer, Quebec where often she was involved in the training of NATO pilots in amongst her other duties. It wasn't long before she was off to an isolated posting in northern Quebec. There she met and married Dennis Moore and had her first child, Debra. This was a time (1957-not that long ago) where once women in the military had a child, they could not longer be in the service. Thus, her career with the military ended after 2 and a half years.

Their next posting as a young family was to Ottawa, Ontario, with three more children arriving –unfortunately after 10 years, she and her husband decided to divorce.

Always having been an athlete and now a stay-at-home single mother, it was suggested that it might be time for her to find something to do outside the home, so she ran with the idea and eventually took up golf.

It was here she met a golf pro, John Henry Green from Montreal and they married in 1973 while they were living in Florida. This marriage endured (over 30 years) with John unfortunately passing away in Almonte in 2009, from leukemia.

This blended family saw Nanette with her four children and John with his six children - one can only imagine those busy times. Living in Florida, John continued on as a golf pro and they also started a construction company during their years in the United States.

But, John had always had a dream of training race horses; he had spent a lot of time with his uncle at the race track in his younger years and the bug had hit. It was time to give up the golfing and the construction company and head out on new adventures. John, one day jumped on the back of a sulky driver's cart and asked to be taught everything the fellow knew. And, so it began.

Moving to an acreage near Perth, Ontario, John was busy now with the horse farm and Nanette took a job with Imperial Oil first at the office in Ottawa, then as the agent for Imperial Oil in Perth.

Her love of sport has continued throughout life; she ran a women's gym in Ottawa for a few years (Vic Tanny's) and also had taken up tennis while they were living in Florida, eventually becoming a member of the South Florida Tennis Team.

There had always been a longing in John's heart and soul to build his own golf course, so another adventure began. Land was purchased, ground broke in 1997 for what is now known as Greensmere Golf & Country Club, off March Road and the rest is history. But not without a lot of hard work; they moved to Almonte, Ontario and started a little restaurant in one of the strip malls while Greensmere was coming to life. For nine years they had that little restaurant, Burger Tyme, until one day another decision – it was time to sell as the golf course was almost ready. Momma's Restaurant had just burned down so the day Burger Tyme little restaurant went up for sale, it was purchased and handover to Mamma's owners the Friday of that week.

Greensmere is well known in this area (consisting of two 18 hole courses). Nanette has

spent many hours working at the golf course filling in where ever needed. The gardens took a huge part of her time, a labour of love. Nanette, herself has five grandchildren and 9 great grandchildren. Greensmere continues to this day with many of the Green's family at the helm – a daughter is CEO, a grandson is Director of Golf, a son in law is Manager of Maintenance, and a grandson is a groundskeeper. A granddaughter and a step-grandson are now also working at the club.

Nanette arrived at Orchard View by the Mississippi nine months ago now, and is absolutely delighted with her little studio apartment. Although she has given up her car, Nanette loves to walk and finds time for that as often as possible.
